

CLUFF, MRS. KARL

On Sunday last, Mrs. Karl Cluff, of Thatcher died at Pima. Mrs. Cluff had been an invalid for about two years and her condition finally became so desperate that it became necessary for her to undergo a surgical operation, which was performed at Pima on Saturday by Drs. Wightman, Platt and Wish. The physicians had very little hope of saving her and the operation was decided upon as a last resort. She rallied from the operation and was apparently growing stronger until a few hours before death. The funeral services were held in Thatcher and were largely attended. Mrs. Cluff leaves a husband, one child and a large number of other relatives to mourn her untimely death.

Dropped Dead. Early Tuesday morning Trinidad Cruse dropped dead at the home of the Poncho family in Safford. He came here about ten days ago to visit his brother. On Tuesday morning he was at the Poncho house and was in the act of drinking a cup of coffee, when he fell over dead without a moment's warning. He was buried in the Union cemetery on Wednesday.
