

## **DALLAS, ERASTRUS F.**

VETERAN PASSES AWAY. Erastus F. Dallas goes to His Long Rest. Erastus Fletcher Dallas, aged 73 years, died at his home on M street Tuesday evening, April 4<sup>th</sup>, from jaundice. Mr. Dallas was born in Ohio in 1838. When the civil war broke out he enlisted in the 114<sup>th</sup> Ohio regiment and served all through the war. At the close of the war he settled in Illinois and engaged in farming. He cam to the Gila valley eleven years ago and took charge of Caruther's ranch, later going to Duncan, where he remained a short time, returning to Safford, where he lived until his death. He leaves a widow and seven children: William, of Safford; Chester, of Globe; Charles, of Ft. Thomas; Walter, of Colorado, and two sons and a daughter in Illinois. The funeral took place from his late home Tuesday afternoon and was larely attended. Rev. P. D. Gardner conducted the services. President Andrew Kimball was also present and bore testimony o the good life of the deceased. The interment was made in Union cemetery.
