climate, he having been in bad health for several months. Friday, he returned from the oil fields, near Bowie, on account of sickness, and underwent an operation Saturday. He rallied from the effects of the operation, but other complications set in which greatly weakened him, and he became unconscious and gradually passed away, the end coming at noon Monday. Mr. Jones leaves a widow and two children, who resided here with him. The remains were shipped Tuesday morning to his old home near Springfield, Ill., and were accompanied by his mother, Mrs. A. J. Jones; his sister, Mrs. A. V. Jones and his widow and two children.
